Gisteren heb ik gevoetbald.

I played football yesterday.

Stel dat je gisteren tussen 14:00 en 15:00 hebt gevoetbald. Dan kun je zeggen dat je om 14:30 aan het voetballen was: al begonnen en nog niet afgelopen

At around 14:30 I was playing football.

I was playing = al begonnen en nog niet afgelopen.

Present Continuous

to be (am/is/are) + ww-ing

I am you are he/she/it is we are you are they are

Past Continuous

to be (was/were) + ww-ing

I was
you were
he/she/it was
we were
you were
they were

In het verleden bezig

Present Continuous

to be (am/is/are) + ww-ing

I am watching a movie now.

You are being annoying!

He is currently travelling in Finland.

We are listening to some music.

They are trying to help her.

Past Continuous

to be (was/were) + ww-ing

I was reading when you called.

You were looking the other way.

Jesse was cleaning her room when it fell.

We were waiting for you...

They were driving home when it happened.





Signaalwoorden

Present Simple

always, never, sometimes, on Sundays, regularly, often, seldom, in the weekends...

Past Simple

yesterday, last weekend, when I was young, in 1756....

Present Continuous

now, currently, at the moment, Listen! Do you see that?....

Past Continuous: when/while/at the same time...

Als je een zin in de *past continuous* vragend of ontkennend wilt maken, gelden dezelfde regels als in het Nederlands. Je draait bij vragen het onderwerp en het eerste werkwoord (*was/were*) om, bij ontkenningen zet je tussen de twee werkwoorden *not*.

<u>Vragende zinnen (Was/Were + onderwerp + werkwoord + ing)</u>

Waren jullie aan het dansen? → Were you dancing?

Was jij je hond aan het uitlaten? → Were you walking your dog?

Ontkenningen zinnen (onderwerp + was/were not + werkwoord + ing)

Wij waren niet aan het opletten. → We weren't paying attention.

Ik was echt niet jouw berichtjes aan het lezen. → I really wasn't reading your text messages.
